What is the Document Based Question? The DBQ is the first of two essay questions you'll face on the AP US History exam. Unlike the other essay question, in which you'll choose between two essay prompts that rely heavily upon your memory of the course content, the DBQ asks you to answer a question with specific reference to a number of documents that are provided for you within the exam booklet.

How to Ace the DBQ on the AP US History Exam

Short Description: The document-based question measures your ability to analyze and synthesize historical data and to assess verbal, quantitative, or visual materials as historical evidence. As with the long essay, responses to the document-based question will be judged on your ability to formulate a thesis and support it with relevant evidence.
