

Guided Reading Tips For Parents

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Guided reading is also referred to as Fountas and Pinnell Levels after its founders. How Does Guided Reading Work? Guided reading is used in the classroom for small-group instruction. When your child enters a new grade, he or she is assessed and assigned a guided reading level based on word knowledge, comprehension, and fluency. The levels range alphabetically from A to Z, with level A representing the lowest level and level Z the highest.
