When the March entered Greenwood on June 16, police arrested Carmichael as the marchers tried to pitch their tents in a schoolyard.

On 17th June, 1966, Stokely Carmichael, the chairman of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), spoke at a rally in Greenwood, Mississippi, and argued for Black Power. Carmichael defined this as "a call for black people in this country to unite, to recognize their heritage, and to build a sense of community".

After stepping down as SNCC chair, Carmichael wrote the book *Black Power: The Politics of Liberation* (1967) with Charles V. Hamilton. It is a first-person reflection on his experiences in SNCC and his dissatisfaction with the direction of the Civil Rights Movement in the late 1960s.

Once they had established themselves in New York, his parents sent for Stokely and his two sisters to join them in 1952. He published a collection of essays promoting African socialism under the title *Stokely Speaks: Black Power Back to Pan-Africanism* in 1971.

Stokely Standiford Churchill Carmichael, also known as Kwame Ture, was a Trinidadian-American black activist active in the 1960s American Civil Rights Movement. He rose to prominence first as a leader of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC, pronounced "Snick") and later as the "Honorary Prime Minister" of the Black Panther Party.
